Good hold on the north end with direct hand line.                E: Indirect line on a trail for about 1 mile to avalanche chute, and then retardant line that will anchor E and S. Will do some firing at the head of that watershed in the next several days with aerial and hand ignition planned.                S. Fire has hit a rocky top ridgeline, part of the line with indirect dozer line on the west end of the fire to tie the line to the North with both direct and indirect line building.</li> </ul> Strategies: This is a combination of direct and indirect line building to keep the fire out of the community and into the forest wilderness area. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Political Issues / Community Meetings                4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend, businesses are unhappy but they understand the nature of the fire. Lifting evacuation and open the community to all local residence by Thursday. However, access to the FS closed. Perhaps a staged/phased in lifting of the evacuation. They will be working with the Sherriff's office.</li> </ul> Last night's meeting had 110 people at the community meeting. Next meeting is scheduled Wednesday at 1800 at the Central fire house.
