- South: Looking well. Will pull one crew off and keep one to monitor that part of the line.
 - SW: HWY 191 indirect line, looking to put fire on the ground to cut off the corner of 191 and Granite Creek to keep it out of the Granite drainage, where there is heavy fuels. Fire has established itself in the Granit Creek area, this is a concern.
 - N/NE: Unstaffed as the fire continues to chunk and grow on that end of the fire.
 - E: Protecting hay fields and ranches and allowing evacuees to return if they wish. Working with County and Sheriff's office to allow residence back in the area
 - No critical needs.
 - Hwy 191/189 closed. Talking with Dept of Transportation Wyoming to reopen the road.
 - 0 accident / 0 injuries
 - Community meeting last night went very well, 130-150 people.

In brief information is unknown, but will follow up. • Steep area, difficult terrain, with turnaround times for the SEATS very long. Fire is inaccessible to vehicle traffic and heavy equipment. • Working to open the Austin SEAT Base to improve SEAT capability. • No critical needs.
4 Fire: MM14 Hwy 21 IC: Lindsey Neiwert Report by: Mike Morcum	4300 / 50% / 255 / 1.4 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to improve perimeter line. The crews were able to build line around the entire perimeter yesterday. Today they will spend the day strengthening that line. • Working on the summit near lucky peak and communication site to reservoir to secure the line where heavy fuels exist. • No public meeting, evacuation lifted. There are 500 residence on the north end of the fire that is still a concern. Also the highway corridor and the power lines for that area still pose a concern. • Closures continue on FS lands for public access. • No critical resources needed.
