WEST IDAHO ZONE TRAINING COMMITTEE

Committee Charter (revised 10/11/2018)

Mission Statement

The primary mission is to provide an interagency approach and oversight to incident training coordination in the Great Basin Geographic Area. Additionally the Committee officers represent their members through participation in WIZTC (West Idaho Zone Training Committee) and GBTC (Great Basin Training Committee) activities.

Purpose

Within the authority of each agency, the purpose is to improve West Idaho incident training coordination and effectiveness within the Great Basin Geographic Area, formalize the process by which incident training and priority trainee nominations are prioritized, formally administer actions to resolve barriers, document meetings, actions, and decisions, elevating appropriate resolutions, forward issues and proposals to the GBTC. This organization will also provide a forum with which to disseminate informational updates to field units.

Membership

Membership of the West Idaho Zone Training Committee will consist of representatives from three training "co-operatives". These co-operatives are interagency and based on geographic locations, and therefore the agencies agree that representation by co-operative will incorporate appropriate agency involvement. Various specialists representing their agency may provide expertise as needed or requested with regard to the committee workload.

The three Idaho Zone Training Cooperatives are:

- Southwest Idaho Fire Training Co-op
 - Boise District BLM (ID-BOD); Idaho Department of Lands (ID-SWS, ID-BOS); Boise National Forest (ID-BOF)
- West Central Idaho Training Co-op •
 - **IQCS Prioritization Level 2** o Payette National Forest (ID-PAF); McCall Smokejumpers (ID-PAF); Idaho Department of Lands (ID-PAS, ID-SIS)
- NIFC Training Co-op
 - BLM State Office (ID-ISO); Deer Flat Wildlife Refuge (ID-DFR), the National 0 Interagency Fire Center (ID-FCD, ID-FCR, ID-FCP, ID-FCA, ID-BFW, OAS, OWF); Bureau of Reclamation, Snake River Area Office (ID-SRL)-all of whom are collected by the Great Basin Training Unit, NIFC Forest Service (ID-FCF); and Idaho Department of Lands (ID-IDS)

Local fire departments will be represented by closest IDL organization.

Nomination Process

Within the Great Basin Geographic Area, the GBTC is made up of four zones: Nevada, Utah, West Idaho, and East Idaho/Wyoming. During the GBTC nomination prioritization process, each zone is equally represented and afforded training slots as such at **Level 4** of the IQCS nomination process.

Idaho Department of Lands employees statewide are also included in Great Basin prioritization.

Officers

Committee membership consists of representation from each agency within the Training Coops, at a minimum. Other members (Fire Managers, Subject Matter Experts, etc...) are welcome and encouraged to attend committee meetings.

The chairperson is selected by rotation and is responsible for scheduling committee meetings, setting the agenda, updating the committee charter as necessary, and serves as the committee representative to the GBTC.

The Chair rotation among primary members starts as follows:

\triangleright	West Central Idaho	2019-2020
\triangleright	Southwest Idaho	2021-2022
\triangleright	NIFC	2023-2024

The Chairperson will serve for two years. The rotation alternates so that each co-op is represented. The Chair will be the Zone representative to attend the GBTC meetings and represent the West Idaho Zone. The out-going and new-coming chairpersons will participate together at the fall prioritization meeting to facilitate transition; the transition period will extend no later than the end of the Calendar Year.

Meeting Schedules

- Committee meetings: The Committee will meet at least twice per year. Spring meeting
 will include Great Basin Priority Trainee ranking, Course Needs Analysis and committee
 business. Fall meeting will include NWCG Nominations Prioritization, committee
 business, and updates to the charter and contact list, including rotation of Chairperson.
 Local training needs/course schedules will also be addressed at the fall meeting.
- Unit (or Agency) Meetings: Each unit will meet prior to the Co-op meeting to complete IQCS Level 1 prioritization.
- Training Co-op Meetings: The Training Co-ops will meet the first full week in October to complete IQCS Level 2 prioritization.

- Zone Meetings: The West Idaho Zone will meet the second full week in October to complete IQCS Level 3 prioritization.
- The GBTC meeting is typically held the third full week in October and will complete Great Basin nomination prioritization through IQCS Level 4.

Coordination/Presentation of Courses

Agencies involved in the West Idaho Zone will equitably share in the coordination and presentation of specific courses and may present additional courses as needed. Prior to presenting any additional courses, agencies are advised to contact the zone coordinator to obtain the most current information. The host agency will ensure federal students and instructors are awarded the training competency in IQCS.

Local priority for locally-delivered courses will be considered. Regardless of coordinating agency, courses should be open to all agency personnel and should be widely advertised. The West Idaho Zone seeks to provide maximum opportunity for everyone to participate in necessary training which might otherwise be missed.

Training Costs

It has been standard procedure for training costs to be covered by the coordinating agency. As such, there will normally not be any tuition associated with training courses. However, fees may be charged for those courses which incur unusual or unexpected expenses. Tuition fees, if any, will be identified in the course alert.
