Remarks:

The "NW MAC Ready Reserve Strategic Direction" dated September 5th, 2006 is amended in the following manner and is effective at 18:00 today:

- Ready Reserve Strategy Incidents will no longer be asked to maintain an identified "ready reserve" of resources for deployment to a new incident.
- Reallocation of resources from an existing incident to a new or higher priority remains an important method to deal with critical resource shortages. However, no reallocation will occur without the involvement of the Incident Commander and the Agency Administrator. Discussions between NW MAC Support Group Coordinators (Aviation and/or Operations) and key IMT staff related to resource "shortages" and "sharing opportunities" is expected to continue until resource availability improves.
