2. Continue to support large incidents and look for opportunities for early containment and reallocation of assets
3. Monitor and manage for fire fighter fatigue and crew availability

2	Cache Creek	OR WWF	Rapp	Very complex terrain with high probability of large fire growth, private lands involved
3	Waterfalls 2	OR WSA	Williams	Active fire behavior, ongoing burn outs, long duration incident
4	Diamond Butte	WA YAA	Johnson	Improving lines, no critical resource needs
5	Taylor Bridge	WA SES	Reed	Mop up, transition Saturday at 0600
6	Barry Point	OR FWF	Morcom	Mop up, transition Saturday at 0600
7	Butte	OR UPF	Fillis	Mop up, transition Saturday at 0600
