2	Wenatchee Complex	WA-OWF	Pendleton	Covers larger geographic area; more communities threatened than Table Mountain
3	Table Mountain Complex	WA-OWF	Reed	Merged with Wenatchee Complex at Peavine Branch
4	Okanogan Complex	WA-OWF	Williams	Active fire on both Goat and Buckhorn, residences threatened
5	Yakima Complex	WA-OWF	Johnson	Fire above Hwy 12, traffic control measures are in place
6	Pole Creek	OR-DEF	Watts	No critical resource needs; TOC tentatively scheduled for 9/26
7	Cascade Creek	WA-GPF	LaFave	High probability of success in meeting control objectives
