2. Pro-actively manage fatigue

3	Mile Marker 28	WA-YAA	Rabe	Increased containment; best opportunity for success
4	Colockum Tarps	WA-WFS	Nickey	Substantial growth; Level 2 evacuations in place
5	Whiskey Complex	OR-UPF	Williams	Historic structures and private timberlands at risk
6	Labrador	OR-RSF	Fillis	Smoke impacts; still assessing need
7	Sunnyside Turnoff	OR-WSA	Watts	Transfer of command to local unit @1800 today
