3	Whiskey Complex	OR-UPF	Williams	SW OR MAC	Multiple values at risk; southern perimeter active; critical resource needs
4	Big Windy Complex	OR-MED	Schulte	SW OR MAC	Critical short-term opportunity requiring additional resources
5	Colockum Tarps	WA-WFS	Nickey		Precipitation has moderated fire spread and resources being released
6	Brimstone	OR-SWO (712S)	Thorpe/Cline	SW OR MAC	Spot fires are being contained; working on securing line which may be tested today
7	Labrador	OR-RSF	Fillis	SW OR MAC	Preparation for long-term confinement strategy
8	Mile Marker 28	WA-YYA	Rabe		Gradual demobilization occurring
