#### **Strategic Intent:**

- 1. Manage geographic distribution of Initial Attack resources to efficiently and effectively respond to new starts by:
  - a. Reallocating resources for increased Initial Attack as needed.
  - b. Coordinating initial attack between incidents and units, maximizing lend-lease and the sharing of resources.
  - c. Maintaining the investments made on long-term incidents when the reallocation of resources occurs.
- 2. Manage IMTs to effectively respond to complex fires across the Geographic Area by:
  - a. Utilizing surge resources for critical missions that maximize opportunities to safely meet incident objectives.
  - b. Planning for limited replacement or reallocation of shared resources from NMAC.

5	Miles	OR-UPF	Turman	Includes old S. Umpqua Complex, Sugar Pine, Good View. Active fire behavior. Level III evacuations.
6	Taylor Creek	OR-MED	Schulte	Level III evacuations. 1500 residences threatened. Firing operations around Galice and Bear Camp.
7	Klondike	OR-RSF	Schulte	Level I and III evacuations.
