Strategic Intent:

- 1. Manage geographic distribution of Initial Attack resources to efficiently and effectively respond to new starts by:
 - a. Reallocating resources for increased Initial Attack as needed.
 - b. Coordinating initial attack between incidents and units, maximizing lend-lease and the sharing of resources.
- 2. Maintain the investments made on long-term incidents when the reallocation of resources occurs.
- 3. Manage IMTs to effectively respond to complex fires across the Geographic Area by:
 - a. Utilizing surge resources for critical missions that maximize opportunities to safely meet incident objectives.
 - b. Planning and making deliberate decisions on limited replacement or reallocation of shared resources from NMAC.

6	Taylor Creek	OR-MED	Schulte	Level III evacuations. 1500 residences threatened. Transitioning with another IMT1 8/13. Klondike Fire crossed the Illinois River.
7	Miriam	WA-OWF	Knerr	Level II and III evacuations in place. Transition with another IMT2 8/14. Received precipitation.
