#### **Strategic Intent:**

- 1. Maintain the investments made on long-term incidents when the reallocation of resources occurs.
- 2. Facilitate and coordinate initial attack between incidents and units, maximizing lend-lease and the sharing of resources.
- 3. Forecast need of and manage IMTs to effectively respond to complex fires across the **Geographic Area by:** 
  - a. Utilizing surge resources for critical missions that maximize opportunities to safely meet incident objectives.
- 4. Planning and making deliberate decisions on limited replacement or reallocation of shared resources from NMAC.

#### **PNW Incident Priorities** (set once per day):

1	Initial Attack			Initial Attack is always the first priority.
2	Boyds	WA-NES	Rabe	Level II and III evacuations in place. Critical infrastructure impacted. Highway closures.
3	Cougar Creek	WA-OWF	Young	Level III evacuations. Also managing three other fires.
4	Taylor Creek	OR-MED	Kurth	Level III evacuations. Klondike Fire threat to Highway 199 corridor.
5	Natchez	OR-RSF	Goicoechea	Level I, II and III evacuations. Burning out indirect lines.
6	Miles	OR-UPF	Turman	Level III evacuations for 38 residences. Continued active fire behavior. Some reductions in evacuation levels.
7	Crescent Mountain	WA-OWF	Dueitt	Level II evacuations. Making progress on protection objectives.
