- **1.** Facilitate and coordinate initial attack between incidents and units, maximizing lend-lease and the sharing of resources.
- 2. Maintain the investments made on long-term incidents when the reallocation of resources occurs.
- **3.** Forecast need for and manage IMTs to effectively respond to complex fires across the Geographic Area.
- 4. Utilize surge resources for critical missions that maximize opportunities to safely meet incident objectives.
- 5. Plan and make deliberate decisions on limited replacement or reallocation of shared resources from NMAC.
