| 3 | P515/Lionshead | OR-WSA | Lawson | No evacuation levels in place. Scouting opportunities in southwest corner that threatens Metolius River Canyon. |
| 4 | Beachie Creek | OR-WIF | Gales | Assessing structure protection around Jawbone Flats. Closures not fully implemented. |
| 5 | White River | OR-MHF | Livingston | Level 1 and 2 evacuation notices. Containment lines adjacent to structures are secure. Making progress. |
| 6 | Sweet Creek MP2 | OR-781S | Hessel | Reevaluating level 1, 2 and 3 evacuations. Road and area closures. Fire is lined and plumbed. Ongoing mop-up. |
