Strategic Intent:

- Continue to support IA/emerging incidents and new IMT deployments.
- Keep existing incidents staffed by replacing timed out resources as needed.
- Allocate critical resources to augment crucial missions and expedite incident objectives.

PNW Incident Priorities (set daily):

Priority	<u>Fire</u>	<u>Unit</u>	<u>IC</u>	Rationale
1	Initial Attack			Initial attack is always the first priority.
2	Double Creek/ Sturgill/Nebo/Goat Mountain Two	OR-WWF	Lane	Significant fire growth to the north; impacts to public and firefighter safety. Two wilderness fires border watershed.
3	Rum Creek	OR-MED	Gales	Level 1, 2, and 3 evacuations in place. Structure protection in place. Firing operations continue to secure lines.
4	White River/ Irving Peak	WA-OWF	Stock	Level 1 and 2 evacuations in place. No critical needs.
5	Cedar Creek	OR-WIF	Sheldon	Level 2 and 3 evacuations in place. Active fire behavior is challenging suppression strategies.
6	Crockets Knob	OR-MAF	Dimke	Level 1 evacuations and area closures in place. Active fire behavior on north flank.
7	Boulder Mountain	WA-NES	Johnston	Shadowing T3 Team. TOC at 0600 on 9/5.
8	Windigo/Potter/ Big Swamp	OR-UPF/ OR-WIF	Albrecht	Mop-up, patrol, backhaul and suppression repair. No critical needs.
