Strategic Intent:

- Preposition resources as needed to respond to new starts from lightening holdovers.
- Continue to supply existing incidents with resources that meet their most critical needs, per our prioritization process.
- Continue to support IA/Emerging incidents and new IMT deployments.

PNW Incident Priorities (*set daily*):

<u>Priority</u>	<u>Fire</u>	<u>Unit</u>	<u>IC</u>	Rationale
1	Initial Attack			Initial attack is always the first priority.
2	Lookout	OR-WIF	Albrecht	Overnight Level 3 evacuations. 1,000 acres growth, reassessing ingress, egress routes. Unified command with OSFM. Level 2 and 3 evacuations in place. Taskforce
3	Bedrock	OR-WIF	Dimke	of OSFM enroute. Lost primary option on the north flank.
4	Sourdough	WA-NCP	Lawson	SR 20 has closed sections. Level 1 and 2 evacuations.
5	Salmon	OR-WIF	Dimke	80 percent containment. No critical needs.
6	Flat	OR-RSF	Schuster	Minimal fire behavior. Continue to strengthen NE corner
