## **Strategic Intent:**

- Continue to support initial attack, emerging incidents, and new IMT deployments.
- Prioritize critical missions that maximize opportunities to safely meet incident objectives and to augment local unit initial attack resources where needed.
- Keep existing incidents adequately staffed by replacing timed out resources as needed.

## **PNW Incident Priorities (set daily):**

<b>Priority</b>	<u>Fire</u>	<u>Unit</u>	<u>IC</u>	Rationale
1	Initial Attack			Initial attack is always the first priority.
2	Camp Creek	OR-MHF	Kuo	Bull Run municipal watershed. Protecting watershed infrastructure.
3	Tyee Ridge Complex	OR-730S	Hessel	Level 1 and 2 evacuations. Level 3 dropped. Unified command with OSFM. Making good progress on Big Tom and Lighthouse fires.
4	Lookout	OR-WIF	DeMasters	Level 1, 2, and 3 evacuations, although some level 3 were reduced along Highway 126. Portion of Highway 242 closed. Includes Horse Creek and Pothole.
5	Cowlitz Complex	WA-GPF	Hohn	Assessing approximately 40 fires in the complex. Significant public presence over the next several days.
6	Dinner	OR-UPF	Dimke	Level 2 evacuations on Grizzly (Bohemia Mining Area). Assessing area closures and values at risk.

<b>Priority</b>	<u>Fire</u>	<u>Unit</u>	<u>IC</u>	Rationale
7	Petes Lake	OR-WIF	Lawson	Area closures including the Pacific Crest Trail. Developing point protection and confinement strategy.
8	Chilcoot	OR-UPF	Aragon	Incident includes Ridge. Area closures in place, securing Chilcoot repeater.
9	Flat	OR-RSF	Behrens	Incident includes Anvil. Precipitation slowed fire growth to the south. Minimal fire behavior on Flat.
10	Gray	WA-NES	LeFevre	Level 1 evacuations. Two WA State Taskforces remain. Secure and mop-up around structures and I-90 corridor. TOC to IMT3 on 9/2 at 1800.
11	Bedrock	OR-WIF	DeMasters	Level 1 evacuations. Mop-up, patrol, and repair.
