## **Strategic Intent**

- Continue to prioritize initial attack and support emerging incidents.
- Implement strategic resource placement commensurate with incident priorities and predicted fire weather and fuels conditions.
- Allocate resources to augment critical missions and expedite incident objectives.

## PNW Incident Priorities (set daily):

| Priority | Fire                               | Unit              | IC       | Rationale  |
|----------|------------------------------------|-------------------|----------|--|
| 1        | Initial Attack                     |                   |          | Initial attack is always the first priority.   |
| 2        | Lower Sugarloaf/<br>Labor Mountain | WA-OWF            | Osborne  | Level 2 and 1 evacuations are in effect. Critical power infrastructure threatened.   |
| 3        | Rattlesnake/Lynx<br>Mountain       | WA-COA            | LeFevre  | Level 3, 2, and 1 evacuations are in effect. Road, trail, and area closures. Timber and Tribal values threatened.  |
| 4        | Crown Creek/<br>Katy Creek         | WA-NES/<br>WA-COF | Dimke    | Level 3, 2, and 1 evacuations are in effect. Natural and timber resources threatened. Transfer of command to CIMT NR Team 6 planned for 9/16.  |
| 5        | Moon Complex                       | OR-RSF            | Ingram   | Level 3 evacuation is in effect. Road, trail, and area closures. Complex includes three incidents with limited access and challenging terrain. Historic and recreational waterway values threatened. |
| 6        | Tacoma Creek                       | WA-NES            | Johnston | Road closures in place. Wildlife refuge, timber, and power infrastructure threatened.  |

| 7        | Kelsey Peak | OR-MED | Quinones | Level 2 and 1 evacuations are in effect. Area closures in place.   |
| 8        | Emigrant    | OR-WIF | Boehm    | Road, trail, and area closures. Natural and timber resources, and hydroelectric infrastructure threatened.   |
| 9        | Wildcat     | WA-OWF | North    | Level 2 evacuations are in effect. Road, trail, and area closures. Historical properties threatened. Transfer of command to local unit planned for 9/16. |
| 10       | Bridge      | OR-MAF | Opliger  | Road, trail, and area closures.  |
