2004 PIDC Annual Report

2004 started with more moisture then we had seen in the last 4 years, with our first fire reported on January 5th. We received our near normal precipitation but then we went into a drying trend in March with high temps and high fire danger across the Pueblo zone. By the end of March we were getting lightning fires with one becoming a Fire Use incident on BLM lands, this was the earliest one we have on record. We went into April thinking about severity resources for the PSICC but on April 30th we received a much needed snow storm that lowered our fire danger. May turned out to be typical for the zone with a combination of human and lightning caused incidents. June, July and August across the Colorado portion of the zone saw above rainfall with storms coming through the area every 7-10 days. Kansas portion of the zone saw the fire danger making sweeping changes from low to high depending on what area of Kansas you were in, even though they did receive moisture to reduce their drought. We still were picking up lightning and human caused fires but none were escaping I.A. PIDC started to support the Southeast with overhead for their multiple hurricanes that went through the area until November Our last fire incident happened on December 30th in Kansas. PIDC has turned to a 7 day a week year around staffing due to our active winter months and interaction with cooperators. This has reduced the hours of overtime and had no




additional impact to our budget.




PIDC ZONE REPORTED WILDLAND FIRES (173 TOTAL)







PIDC ZONE WILDLAND FIRE ACRES (12,912 TOTAL ACRES)








2004 Incidents Compared to 2003 2004 (in Blue) & 2003 (in Red)
