MORALE OF CREWS: Very Good

INJURIES: None

MESSAGE: Jim and I visited with the IC in Venete AK where the VA crew is assigned to the Joint Lake fire. The crew is doing very well. They are working with a local Venete tribal crew (the only 2 crews working the 4300 acre fire) and are well supported in an ideal remote Yukon camp setting. The crews are focusing on just a small portion of the line that spotted over the river containing the fire. The fire is on F&W lands, and the portion they are working on is on native lands. The tribe wants the fire out on their lands. The IC said that their work was nearly done and likely they would have to be up for reassignment as early as Monday. In the several hours we were in Venete we met and spoke with other tribal members of Venete who were working as camp crew and other positions. If the VA crew has taken the opportunity to interact with the Venete crew it will likely be a remarkable cultural exchange for all concerned. Jim and I really enjoyed meeting and talking with these remarkable folks that take near 24 hr daylight in the summer and near 24 hr nighttime in the winter, and 40 to 70 below winter temps, for granted...smiles... We continue to receive very good reports on our southern region crews. While there, an Alaskan Black Bear trekked 100 yds from the ICP. The TN crew was reassigned today from the Stuart Creek Fire, to the Mississippi Fire to join their module cousins the Mississippi crew... I showed the new resource order and C#, and new location, above.
