

## **Southeast Zone Collaborative Fuels Group Charter**

### **Purpose**

The Southwest Coordinating Group (SWCC) has directed each zone to establish a Zone level Fuels Collaborative Group (Group) by February 1, 2006 to review, discuss and prioritize Hazardous Fuel Treatment and Wildland-Urban Interface projects planned to be implemented in the Zone each year, and to provide local smoke coordination. The Group will involve all Zone members and other non-federal partners engaged in hazardous fuel treatment work to participate in this collaborative process.

### **Group Duties and Procedures**



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2. The Group will coordinate smoke management activities through the Zone Dispatch Centers.
3. Each Agency will submit burn plans, as required, to ADEQ.
4. Each participating partner will actively participate in the Group to ensure adequate planning, implementation, communication and coordination of Hazardous Fuel Treatments and resulting Smoke Management activities.


