Subject: Recruitment for Incident Commander and Incident Commander Trainees for the Great Basin Geographic Area Complex Incident Management Teams

Reply Due - October 31, 2024

The Great Basin Coordinating Group is soliciting nominations for Complex Incident Commanders. (IC), Deputy ICs, and IC Trainees to lead Great Basin Complex Incident Management Teams (IMT) for 2025. The intent of this announcement is to recruit applicants for these positions.

Available Positions:

- Complex Incident Commanders for a three-year term.
- Complex Deputy Incident Commanders for a one-year term.
- Complex Trainee Incident Commanders for a one-year term. All Great Basin ICCI trainees will be vetted through this process and the Great Basin Priority trainee program will not be utilized for this position.

Determinations will be made by the Great Basin Coordinating Group based on number of deputy applicants and other pertinent considerations.

Duties: Individuals will be expected to perform with a high level of functional and managerial expertise as an IC, Deputy IC, and/or IC Trainee. Individuals will lead and manage a Complex Incident Management Team. Professional interaction between team members, cooperators, and stakeholders is an absolute necessity when performing in an emergency (and often critical) incident situation. Strong leadership capability is key, with a particular skill demonstrating the ability to build a strong team, create solid cohesion, and use an inclusive approach in leading and mentoring.

Qualifications: All applicants MUST meet qualifications using the current National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) <u>Wildland Fire Qualification System Guide 310-1</u>. Certification of applicant qualification by a Certifying Officer must be submitted (Attachment Form 1). The applicant <u>must address</u> the Knowledge, Skills & Abilities to demonstrate the necessary leadership and communication skills required for this important leadership assignment. The KSA responses do not need to be lengthy, but concise and informative descriptions of the applicant's capabilities.

Duration: The selected IC candidates will fill the position for three years; other candidates will fill the positions for one year. On call rotation will be determined by the Great Basin Operations Committee. How to apply:

Each applicant must provide the following:

 NOMINATION FORM. Certifying officials must certify applicant qualifications are correct.
- 2. Response to KSA's for the 2025 Great Basin IC application
- 3. Copy of your latest IQCS/IQS Report.

Methods of evaluation and selection: The Great Basin Operations Committee is responsible for reviewing the applications for completeness and applying ranking criteria to determine the best-qualified candidates. Selections will be made by the Great Basin Coordinating Group. Selections will be made solely based on applicant merit, fitness, and qualifications. All applicants will receive consideration without regard to race, color, age, sex, marital status, religion, national origin, political affiliation, handicap, or other non-merit factors. The Great Basin Coordinating Group Chair is responsible for notification of selection and non-selections.
