Predictive Services:	<p>...Cool and More Humid this Weekend...</p> <p>SW winds expected again today along with still moderately dry humidity levels across parts of Nevada and Western Utah. However, wind speeds are not expected to be quite as strong as yesterday, and humidity levels should be slightly higher as well. For these reasons we will not extend "High Risk" for any areas today. However, if there are any ignitions, there will be SW winds of 15-30 mph that could carry any fire which has continuous light fuels.</p> <p>Otherwise, clouds and areas of showers will linger in northern areas along with much higher humidity levels. Showers should start tapering off later today into Sunday.</p> <p>Another weak disturbance late Monday in the north could keep spotty shower activity going in ID...otherwise a gradual return to near normal temperature/humidity by the middle of next week. Stronger high pressure may build in late next week with a return to above normal temperatures and unseasonably low humidity levels.</p>
