Predictive Services:	<p>Moisture is beginning to increase across southern Utah and Nevada this morning and will continue to increase northward across the Great Basin through the weekend. Showers and thunderstorms will develop across central and southern Nevada and Utah this afternoon. Most storms will be accompanied by wetting rain. As moisture increases northward, the majority of the area will see wetting rain, though the greatest coverage will be across Utah and Nevada, with very heavy rain possible across the southern half of the Great Basin. Portions of central/southern Utah and Nevada favored by southerly flow may see in excess of an inch of rain by Sunday.</p> <p>Drier air will move into western Nevada on Sunday, shifting storm coverage to the east for Sunday and Monday, with high elevation areas seeing snow. Showers will taper off on Tuesday as drier air moves into the area behind a cold front. Temperatures will remain at or below seasonal norms through the middle part of next week due to cool, northerly flow over the area.</p>

Been working closely with IDL, originally they were thinking Type 3 organization, however, with the rain they might determine a less robust – T4 will suffice. No decision yet – stay tuned.
