- 7 Lakes: No issues. Suppression repair
 - Sage: No issues. Suppression repair
 - Tule: Very active. Primary concern. Pushed north towards canyon with 60 structures and East towards Hwy 445. Structure protection and evacuations. Fire 1 ½ miles from structures. Sutcliff – 4 residences, 2 Vehicles, power structures lost. No power in Sutcliff (restored in about 3 days).
 - Anderson: Very active. Moving North and East. Scattered residences. All prepped.
 - No injuries
 - Light to Moderate media interest
 - Evacuations ordered in Sutcliff. Evacuations in Big Canyon (Tule), Fish Springs (Anderson)
 - Pyramid Lake closed to watercraft for Scooper use
 - Hwy 445: Trying to close. Challenge due to multiple entry points.
 - Critical Resource Needs: One T1 Crew for 4 days
 - Resources available: 7 T2 Crews this morning

Wanting to push more East. Hwy 21 – contingency line on Banner Ridge. Burning into Lowman Complex burn. • East: Headed into burn scars • Southeast: Filled in yesterday. Hwy 2 and Rabbit Creek burn.
