Showers and thunderstorms in S. NV and S. UT. Wetter into E. NV and Central and northern NV today. Wet/Dry in to N. UT and ID on Friday. And Sat. Some lightning, wet/dry. No lightning for W. NV. SW drier windflow in the eastern GB with lightning spreading. Long term: Lightning in each area of the GB – dryness moves in with increase of temps. Central ID mountains will receive precipitation. Moisture with thunderstorms moving fact. No widespread precipitation.
