Massive amount of lightning in ID and W WY. 40-50% wet up to .10 inch. Concern today is how much wind we will get and affect any holdovers. Today: Another front from E OR with lightning. This will be North of Boise, SCF, and East ID. Red Flag warning. Fast moving. Good news is that it will be the second day of .100 inch of rain and higher humidities. Bad news: More lightning. Brief periods of wind gusts. NV will not receive much today. South winds ahead of front into NW UT and SE ID. Monday: Lightning moves out. Increasing winds. ID – higher humidities. Mid-week: Diminished winds. Hot and dry end of the week.
