Cooler Temps and RH recovery at higher elevations. Chance of T-storms for most of UT. Tomorrow conditions moderate with winds shifting back S/SE with increasing temperatures and lower RH. Dry breezy conditions will start to return this weekend and back to higher temps next week.

DeMasters assumed command last night. The S and SW side of fire looking pretty secure. Since there is significant PVT lands effected, will be working on rehab there. With the wind from yesterday, fire pushed to the west about 5 miles closer to FS lands. Could be on their land now. Also activity on the N/NW-working indirect with dozers/resources and think we can button that up in 2 operational periods. Community meeting tonight in Ririe at 1800. Working with FS for area closures. Currently county closures. Threats continue to be trout, sage grouse, structures, sheep and the Bonneville Powerlines. Concerns with hunters and the holiday. One accident with PVT dozer/tipped on its side, agency employee, no injuries. Team will do a report. Critical needs include 4 Tenders, dozers, engines, T1, T2 IA crews, and misc. overhead. Increase of acres (9,000) from last night 209

Completed securing west side yesterday. North side still working its way to an old burn (Lowman) however did not gain much acreage yesterday. East

<p>IC (t) Adell</p>	<p>side had a slop over and could make another push today towards some summer homes. Intent to keep it out of Long Creek drainage. Lots of repair work to be done including lots of dozer line with black on both sides. Scheduled three community meetings the next three days. Still L1 evacuations in place along Hwy 17 and 21. Injuries/illnesses; 1 Agency personnel with structure group had a seizure but will be released today. 1 (Tactical Tender) Life Light with chest pains 2 days ago. Still in hospital with diagnosis of Pneumonia. Resources available to reassign-Engines from structure protection group.</p>
<p>3 Berry IC: Roide</p>	<p>12,279 / 0% / 116/\$843,000+ Major Hwy connecting Grant Teton and south entrance of Yellowstone National Park remains closed. Flagg Ranch and 2 campgrounds remain closed. Structure protection for those entities, perimeter control along Hwy 89 on both the east and west side. Working on Long Term Plans. Otherwise fire will be point protection. Political issues are Hwy 89 closure, and smoke to the town of Jackson, National Parks and with the National Park celebration of 100 years, there are multiple planned events planned today with VIP's attending. Bears are a safety concern. Mitigation on going for that. Critical needs include T2 IA Crew</p>
<p>4 Tie IC: Spencer Johnston</p>	<p>1,242 / 0% / 120 / 150,000 No significant changes from last night's 209. Bird's T2 Team in-brief today at 1000 at FS Supervisor's Office. Team should take over the fire tomorrow at 0600. Concentrated on E side with retardant and scoopers yesterday. Anchor point completed on N side, then direct and indirect line planned work. Concerns are a major powerline, Hwy 31 (scenic byway from Swan Valley to Victor, ID), L1 evacuation for 20 residences located just SW of Victor, ID. Some trail closures on FS lands. Critical needs include T1, T2 crews and aviation.</p>
<p>5 Fire: Peterson Hollow IC: Darren Turner John Platt (t)</p>	<p>1,100/ 10% / 220 / \$1,000,000 Active yesterday with spotting up to ½ mile. Continue to work on securing heal of the fire. Unable to meet objectives without critical needs support. Closures continue for Trails and FS roads with threats to be Beaver Mtn. Ski area, trout habitat and Garden City. Community meeting tonight with multi-cooperators (UT, ID, Caribou-Targhee and Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest. There is also a concern of smoke impacting traffic along Hwy 89. Safety concerns continue to be snags, sink holes and extreme fire behavior. Critical needs; 5 T1 crews, Scoopers, and T1 helicopter.</p>
<p>6 Fire: Sand Ledges IC: S. Nielson</p>	<p>3,100 / 90% / 94 / \$750,000.00 Mop up efforts continue. Glide path to T4 this afternoon. Anticipate 100% containment today.</p>
<p>7 Fires: South Fork Zone Big Elk, Carrot, Black Fires IC: Spencer Johnston</p>	<p>3 Fires are being managed together however not a complex. Big Elk 55 acres, inactive, no concerns Carrot 150 acres NE of Driggs, ID in the Jedidiah Smith Wilderness, monitoring Black Fire 300+ acres north Swan Valley, ID is of concern. Moved to the north, very visable so will do some work on this one. 1 Structure threatened</p>
