DeMasters assumed command last night. The S and SW side of fire looking pretty secure. Since there is significant PVT lands effected, will be working on rehab there. Went onto FS lands about 3-5 acres yesterday. Also activity on the N/NW-working indirect with dozers/hand line and think we can button that up in 1 operational periods. East side still seeing some moderate fire behavior. Community meeting last tonight in Ririe with mostly positive response. Currently county/FS closures. Threats continue to be trout, sage grouse, structures, sheep/cows and the Bonneville Powerlines. Concerns with hunters and the holiday. One minor fender bender vehicle, no injuries and 1 bee sting. Critical needs include 1 Tactical Tender, 3/T1, 4/T2 IA FMAG approved for this fire-

Good day yesterday. Completed securing west side. S/SE side repair to dozer line continues-huge back haul work being worked on. Some containment on north side. Held to the west side of Clear Creek. Still concerns with summer homes. Intent is still to keep it out of Long Creek drainage. Scheduled community meetings with Placerville last night. Overall went well. Crouch meeting tonight. Informal visit from Chief Tidwell yesterday. Still L1 evacuations in place along Hwy 17 and 21.

<p>3 Berry IC: Roide</p>	<p>12,279 / 0% / 260/\$1,100,000.00</p> <p>Moderate fire behavior. Major Hwy connecting Grant Teton and south entrance of Yellowstone National Park remains closed. Work being done on both sides of hwy. and anticipate road to open 3-5 days. Flagg Ranch and 2 campgrounds remain closed. Structure protection for those entities, wrapping Huckleberry Guard Station, perimeter control along Hwy 89 on both the east and west side. Working on Long Term Plans. Otherwise fire will be point protection. Political issues are Hwy 89 closure, and smoke to the town of Jackson.</p> <p>Critical needs include T2 IA Crew if not filed and 1 camp crew.</p> <p>Injury; 1 allergic reaction, but back on line today.</p>

Concentrated on E side with direct hand line. Anchor point completed on N side, then direct and indirect line planned work. Active on SW side with heavy timber with some dead/down.</p> <p>Concerns are a major powerline, hunting season approaching and Hwy 31 (scenic byway from Swan Valley to Victor, ID), L1 evacuation for 20 residences located just SW of Victor, ID. Some trail closures on FS lands.</p> <p>Community meeting tonight at 1900 in Victor.</p>
<p>5 Fire: Peterson Hollow IC: Darren Turner John Platt (t)</p>	<p>1,100/ 10% / 220 / \$1,000,000</p> <p>Active yesterday with spotting up to 1/4 mile. Appreciated the support with resources yesterday. Cooperator meeting last night went well. Safety concerns continue to be snags, sink holes, smoke impacts along Hwy. and fire behavior. Critical needs; T1, T2IA crews, aviation.</p>
<p>6 Fires: South Fork Zone Big Elk, Carrot, Black Fires IC: Spencer Johnston</p>	<p>3 Fires are being managed-</p> <p>Big Elk 68 acres, inactive, no concerns</p> <p>Carrot 218 acres NE of Driggs, ID in the Jedidiah Smith Wilderness, monitoring</p> <p>Black Fire 300+ acres north Swan Valley, ID. Made some small runs yesterday. Area and trail closures on all 3 fires. Fires monitoring via web cam. Total personnel 29</p> <p>Critical needs; assessing today</p>
<p>7 Fire: Briggs IC: Osler</p>	<p>3,347 / 50% / 60/ \$950,000.00</p> <p>Working on contingency line and will fire out if conditions warrant.</p>
<p>8 Fire: Toponce Creek IC: Johnston</p>	<p>265 / 90% / 20 / \$1,600,000.00</p> <p>Anticipate 100% tomorrow. T2 Helicopter available tomorrow.</p>
<p>9 Fire: Rough IC: Rory Anderson</p>	<p>4,130 / 40% / 80 / \$2,400,000.00</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ramping down to T4 team today. Last report
