<b>1</b> <b>Fire: Henry's Creek</b> <b>IC: DeMasters</b>	<p>52,511 / 55% / 443 / 2,900,000.00 (increase of 1 ac)</p> <p>The S and SW side of fire looking pretty secure, holding and mopping as needed. Since there is significant PVT lands effected, will be working on a rehab plan today. Activity on the N/NW-working indirect with dozers/hand line has been successful and threat has diminished. East side still seeing some moderate fire behavior so working hand line there. Currently county/FS closures however no fire on FS lands. Threats continue to be trout, sage grouse, structures, sheep/cows and the Bonneville Powerlines. Concerns with hunters and the holiday. Did lose 1 structure last Tuesday that was not confirmed until yesterday.</p> <p>Critical needs; 3 RADO's</p> <p>Resources to reassign T1 CWN S61 Helicopter and 2 T21A crews tomorrow. FMAG approved for this fire-working on cost share</p>		
<b>2</b> <b>Fire: Pioneer</b> <b>IC: Lund</b> <b>IC (t) Adell</b>	<p>104,475 / 58% / 1547 / 71,000,000.00</p> <p>Good day yesterday. Securing, mopping up and backhaul on west side. S/SE side repair to dozer line continues-huge back haul work being worked on. North side continues to be active and with weather continues to push up fingers. Held to the west side of Clear Creek drainage. Still concerns with summer homes. Intent is still to keep it out of Long Creek drainage. Community meeting with Garden Valley last night. Overall went well.</p>		

<b>3</b> <b>Berry</b> <b>IC: Roide</b>	12,378 / 20% /351/\$1,600,000.00 Working on Point Protection and Perimeter control, particularly focusing on west side of river to reduce threat to Flagg Ranch . Major Hwy connecting Grant Teton and south entrance of Yellowstone National Park remains closed. Flagg Ranch and 2 campgrounds remain evacuated. Structure protection for those entities. Working on Long Term Plans. Otherwise fire will be point protection. Political issues are Hwy 89 closure. Injury/Illness-1 discomfort for 2 days, taken in but released, light duty today Red Flag Conditions today.
<b>4</b> <b>Tie</b> <b>IC: Bird</b>	1,260 / 25% / 250 / 1,035,000. Moderate fire behavior with spotting. Mopping up North Side. Concentrated on E side with direct hand line with support of scoopers and helicopters. Concerns are predicted winds, a major powerline, hunting season approaching and Hwy 31 (scenic byway from Swan Valley to Victor, ID), L1 evacuation for 20 residences located just SW of Victor, ID. Some trail closures on FS lands. Meeting last night in Victor, ID went very well. Accidents; one forklift making contact with a rental vehicle. Report of a repeater box being transported via helicopter and the antenna cable within the box shorted out and actually burnt the paper inside the box. Repeater box still in working condition. Safenet and Safecom being done. Critical needs; 2 T1 and 2 T2 IA crews, 3 engines (no typing) and 1 camp crew
<b>5</b> <b>Fire: Peterson Hollow</b> <b>IC: Darren Turner</b> <b>John Platt (t)</b>	1,200/ 20% / 290 / \$1,900,000.00 Moderate fire behavior with some single tree torching. Meeting objectives to the west. South end going direct and indirect. North end doing some good work as well. Supported UWC with IA yesterday. Safety concerns continue to be snags, sink holes, smoke impacts along Hwy. and fire behavior. Critical needs; 3 T2IA crews, 2 T1 helicopters, AT and Scoopers
<b>6</b> <b>Fire: Briggs</b> <b>IC: Osler</b>	3,418 / 50% / 60/ \$1,070,000.00 Working on contingency line and will fire out if conditions warrant. Plan to turn over fire to a T4 on Tuesday at 1000.
<b>7</b> <b>Fires: South Fork Zone</b> <b>Big Elk, Carrot, Black</b> <b>Fires</b> <b>IC: Deb Flowers</b>	3 Fires are being managed- Big Elk 68 acres, inactive, no concerns Carrot 218 acres NE of Driggs, ID in the Jedidiah Smith Wilderness, monitoring. Black Fire 300+ acres north Swan Valley, ID. Scouting for possible contingency line work. Area and trail closures on all 3 fires. Fires monitoring via web cam. Total personnel 50 Critical needs; T2 IA crews so be successful to meet objectives.
<b>8</b> <b>Fire: Box Canyon</b> <b>IC: Hillman</b>	3,947 / 20 / 40 / 3,000,000.00 Fire was T3 turned to a T4 but reached management actions points so T3 was put back into place yesterday. Evacuated Ledge Fork Campground. Working direct and indirect. Spot in Hell's Kitchen so working that. Critical needs; T1 helicopter
