High Risk for Wind/Lo RH eastern Nevada and western Utah Saturday. Much cooler temperatures and showers to Idaho, western Wyoming and northern Nevada on Sunday. High Risk for Winds/ Low RH through Sunday,, however, the winds will be mainly limited to Utah. Holdover fires could pop up from yesterday's lighting activity across the eastern Great Basin as southwest winds pick up. Maximum temperatures are already on a downward trend and will become quite cool on Sunday/Monday as the main low swings into the region. Wetting rains are possible over much of Idaho and western Wyoming and even the northern fringe of Nevada on Sunday. High elevation snow is also possible in these areas above 8500'. The southern half of the Great Basin will see the cooler temperatures but remain on the drier side, especially by the first part of next week as westerly flow returns.
