No changes with the 209.
Look for increase in the % containment in the next several days. However, the N/NW side of the fire is problematic. Resources continue to work on putting indirect line into that area. Road 591 – 579 from Bruce Meadows to Landmark. It looks like the team will be working hard to get indirect line into this area. The fire has potential to continue to move N/NW for a long time.

WX: Continue to dry out for the next 5-7 days. Still dry and resources are trying to do full suppression wherever possible. Long term is dry for the next 7 to 10 days, with no little precipitation in the forecast.

Branch 1 : East side: north of HWY 17. This is the patrol side of the fire and using old burn scars as natural barriers.
Branch 2 : South of HWY 17: Will monitor this side of the fire.
Rehab is almost done on Branch 2. In a few days 2-3 to work on the rehab.

Spike camp at Bruce Meadows. Caterer, shower unit, etc. Over time this may become the new ICP. Will keep us posted.

No injuries or accidents to report.
