Preparation:


This course requires advance preparation. The course coordinator and instructor cadre must thoroughly review the following information and prepare all materials prior to presenting the course.




Responsibilities Addressed in Unit

算Review

- Incident intelligence describes the collection and analysis of wildland fire or incident-specific data used for strategic planning and decision-making.
- Intelligence and Information Officers deal with similar information, but they disseminate it to different audiences.



早Review

- Formal intelligence flows through the incident support system channels (as stated in Unit 1).
 - o Examples
 - Incident
 - Incident Management Team(s) (IMT)
 - Expanded dispatch
 - Dispatch offices
 - Geographic Area Coordination Center(s) (GACC)
 - National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC)/Multi-Agency Coordinating (MAC) Group(s)
 - Fire and aviation personnel from various agencies and at various organizational levels
 - Other intelligence units
- Accurate and timely reporting of information is an important part of the dispatch/coordination system.

Role of the EDSD

- Collect and consolidate incident resource information.
- · Disseminate the information.

Collect and Consolidate Incident Information

HOW will you find the information?

- Interagency Resource Ordering Capability (IROC) system reports
- Incident Status Summary (ICS 209)
- Local reports

WHAT information are you looking for?

- Number of open or unfilled requests
- Unable to fill (UTF) requests from the local and national levels
- Resources available for reassignment or demobilization

 - o Interagency Resource Ordering Capability (IROC) system reports
 - o Incident Status Summary (ICS 209)
 - Local reports
- Examples of useful information:
 - Number of open or unfilled requests
 - o Unable to fill (UTF) requests (e.g., local, national)
 - o Resources available for reassignment or demobilization

- Formal or informal briefings.
- · Reports, summaries, etc.

WHO will need this information?

- Supervisory dispatcher
- · Information Officer
- Duty Officers/local Multi-Agency Coordinating (MAC) Group
- Geographic Area Coordination Center (GACC)/GACC MAC Group
- National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC)/National MAC (NMAC) Group


Why Is Intelligence Critical?

- · Keeps managers informed to make decisions
- · Competition for resources at higher preparedness levels
- · Aids priority setting
- · Identifies critical resource shortages
- Keeps expanded dispatch informed for support of management decisions
- Provides pertinent information to complete intelligence products


早Review

- Why is intelligence critical?
 - o Keeps managers and expanded dispatch informed to make decisions.
 - o Indicates increased competition for resources at higher preparedness levels.
 - o Aids priority setting.
 - o Identifies critical resource shortages.
 - o Provides pertinent information to all levels of the dispatch/coordination system.



冥Review


- Predictive Services is a unit comprised of meteorologists, Intelligence Coordinators, and additional decision support.
- During periods of heavy fire activity, other specialties are added to the unit, including, but not limited to, fire behavior analysts, fire planners, and Geographic Information System (GIS) specialists.




Fire Potential Outlooks

- Each GACC's Predictive Services Meteorologists produce nationally standardized and regionally specific fire potential products.
 - 7- Day Fire Potential Outlook
 - Monthly/Seasonal Outlook
 - Web briefings
 - Other localized products

- The EDSD collects, consolidates, and disseminates incident resource information.
- Information is found in IROC reports, Incident Status Summary (ICS 209), and local reports and is disseminated via briefings and reports.
- Predictive Services is comprised of meteorologists, Intelligence Coordinators, and additional decision support.
- Predictive Services produces a number of products, including Incident Status Summary (ICS 209), IMSR, active fire maps, and Fire Potential Outlooks.
