As a result of late summer rains and slightly cooler temperatures, on September 5, 2018, the Bureau of Land Management, United States Forest Service, National Park Service, State of Utah will lift fire restriction orders in the following areas.

- **State lands and unincorporated private lands** in Carbon, Emery, Grand and San Juan Counties.
- **BLM** Moab, Monticello and Price Field Office areas located in Carbon, Emery, Grand and San Juan Counties.
- **NPS** including Canyonlands and Arches National Parks, and Natural Bridges and Hovenweep National Monuments.
- **USFS** Moab and Monticello Ranger Districts of the Manti-La Sal National Forest, areas within Grand and San Juan Counties in Utah, and Mesa and Montrose Counties in Colorado.

Fire managers are very pleased with the positive response and public cooperation in adhering to this year's fire restrictions. Your cooperation helps save lives and property. We are still in fire season and vegetation may once again dry out as fall approaches, so it is still important to take precautions and practice fire safety.

Hot exhaust pipes and sparks from vehicles and campfires are some of the most easily preventable causes of wild fire. Please carry a shovel, water, a bucket or a fire extinguisher when working or camping on public lands. Always drown and stir fires to ensure they are completely out before leaving camp. Keep vehicles in good working order, stay on designated roads and trails to avoid igniting dry vegetation with hot exhaust, and keep all chains and straps secured so they don't drag on the ground and cause sparks.

Other areas in the State of Utah may still in fire restrictions for campfires, fireworks and using steel core/jacketed ammunition. Fire Prevention Order UT910-14-001 is permanently in effect for all BLM lands in the State of Utah and prohibits the use/discharge of any kind of fireworks, explosives, incendiary, chemical devices, pyrotechnics and exploding targets. **SPECIAL ORDER OF FOREST SUPERVISOR
MANTI-LA SAL NATIONAL FOREST
MOAB/MONTICELLO RANGER DISTRICT**

FIRE RESTRICTIONS

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 CFR § 261.50(a) and (b), **the following acts are prohibited** on all National forest System Lands described in this Order, within the exterior boundaries of the Moab and Monticello Ranger District Manti-La Sal National Forest beginning **JUNE 15, 2018 at 12:01 AM** and continuing until further notice.

1. Igniting, building, maintaining, or using a fire, including charcoal and briquettes. [36 CFR § 261.52(a)]
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least 3 feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of any flammable material. [36 CFR § 261.52(d)]
3. Using an explosive [36 CFR § 261.52(b)]
4. Blasting, welding, or operating any acetylene or other torch with an open flame. [36 CFR § 261.52 (i)]

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to **36 CFR § 261.50(e)**, the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons using a stove or grill that is solely fueled by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can be turned on and off. Such devices can only be used in an area that is barren or cleared of all overhead and surround flammable materials within three (3) feet of the device.
2. Any Federal, State, or local law enforcement officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

PURPOSE:

To reduce the risk of human caused wildfires during periods of high fire danger and severe fire weather conditions.

AREA DESCRIBED:

All National Forest System Lands located within the Moab and Monticello Ranger Districts of the Manti-La Sal National Forest boundaries, as shown on attached map.

IMPLEMENTATION:

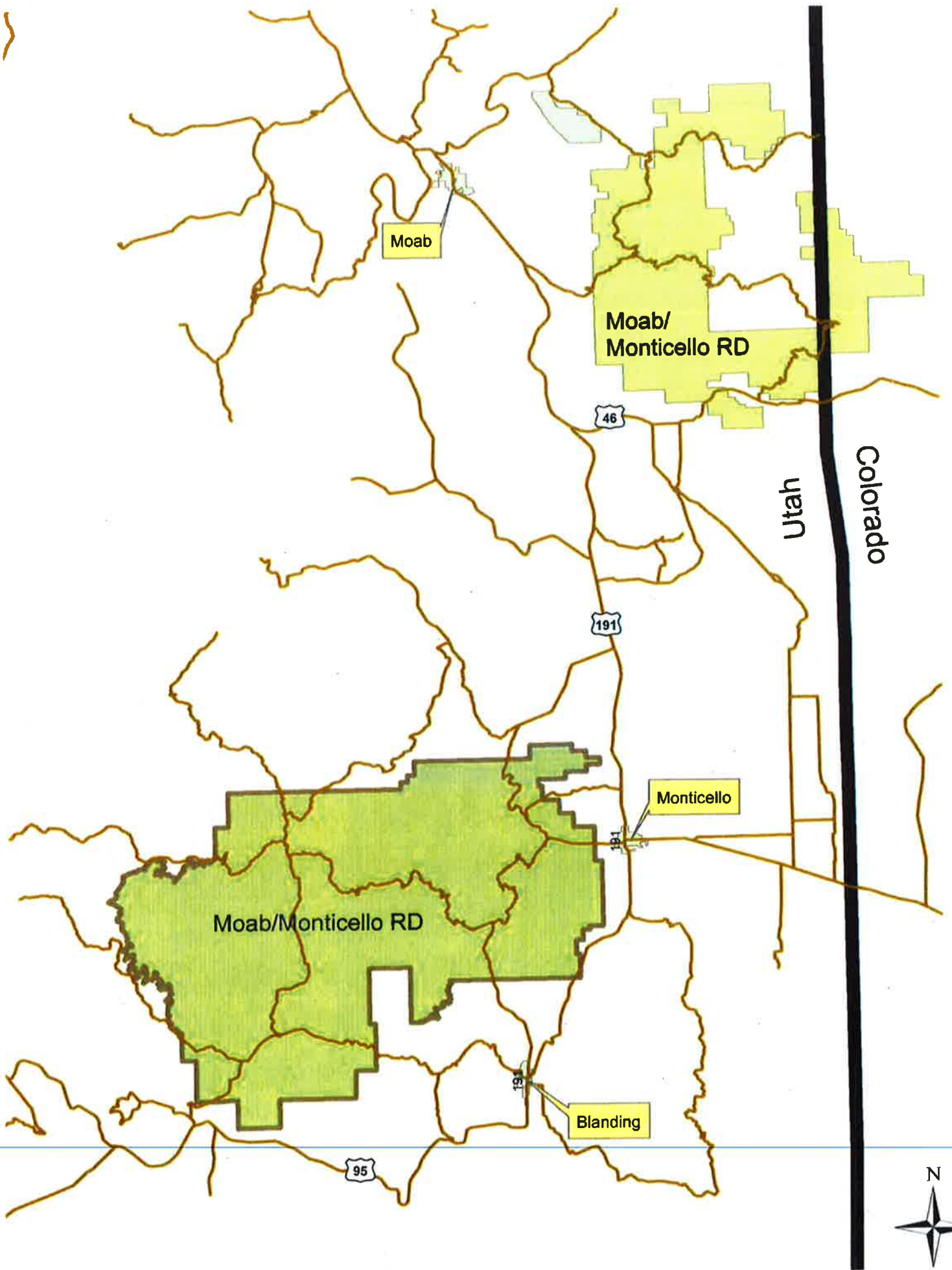
1. This Order will be in effect beginning, **JUNE 15th at 12:01 AM** and shall remain in effect until September 15th or until rescinded whichever occurs first.
2. Exhibit A, "Definitions," is attached and incorporated into this order.
3. Any violation of the above prohibition(s) is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization and/or imprisonment for not more than six months. [Title 16 USC § 551, Title 18 USC § 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC § 3581(b)(7)].
4. Further information regarding this Order may be obtained at the Manti-La Sal National Forest Supervisors Office, Price, UT (435) 636-3500.
5. This Order supersedes any previous Order(s) prohibiting the same, or similar acts prohibited by this Order in the areas covered by this Order.



FIRE RESTRICTIONS

PROHIBITIONS:

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551 and 36 CFR § 261.50(a) and (b), **the following acts are prohibited** on all lands described in this Order, all within the Sanpete, Ferron and Price Ranger Districts Manti-La Sal National Forest boundaries including those areas administered by the Manti-La Sal National Forest beginning **Monday July 9th at 12:01 AM** and continuing until 1 November 2018 or rescinded.

1. Igniting, building, maintaining, or using a fire, including charcoal and briquettes, outside a fire structure that is provided by the Forest Service within a designated area, 36 CFR § 261.52(a); and
2. Smoking outside an enclosed vehicle or building, 36 CFR § 261.52(d).

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Holders of Forest Service Special Use Authorizations issued after the date of this Order specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Persons using a stove or grill that is solely fueled by liquid petroleum fuels.
3. Persons using a stove fire in a designated area as defined in the Order.
4. Persons smoking while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is clear of all flammable materials.
5. Any Federal, State, or local law enforcement officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

PURPOSE:

To reduce the risk of human caused wildfires during periods of high fire danger.

AREA DESCRIBED:

All National Forest System Lands located within the Sanpete, Ferron and Price Ranger Districts of the Manti-La Sal National Forest boundaries and those areas administered by the Manti-La Sal National Forest, as shown on attached map.

DEFINITIONS:

Designated Area: All developed recreation sites (campgrounds and picnic areas) that are maintained and administered by the Forest Service, shown on the current Forest visitor maps, and have a permanent fire structure.

Fire Structure: A permanent metal or concrete structure that is specifically designed for the purpose of containing a campfire or cooking fire and has been installed and maintained by the Forest Service.


Stove Fire: A fire built inside a fully enclosed metal stove, grill, or sheep herder type stove that is outfitted with a chimney that is at least five (5) feet in length that is equipped with a spark arrester consisting of a mesh screen with screen opening of ¼ inch or less.

For additional definitions refer to 36 CFR § 261.2.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect beginning Monday July 9th, 2018 at 12:01 AM and shall remain in effect until 1 November 2018 or rescinded.
2. Violation of the above prohibition(s) is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 per individual, or \$10,000 for an organization and/or imprisonment for not more than 6 months. 16 U.S.C. § 551; 18 U.S.C. §§ 3571(b)(6), 3581(b)(7).
