### **Bridger-Teton Plans Prescribed Burn**

AFTON, WYO: — The Bridger-Teton National Forest plans to conduct a prescribed burn within the Greys River drainage this fall.

The 1800-acre Weiner Creek project area is located off the Greys River Road approximately 10 miles south of Alpine and includes parts of Weiner Creek and the North Fork of Murphy Creek drainage. This fire is a cooperative project supported by the Wyoming Game and Fish Department, the Bridger-Teton National Forest and Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. The project will treat aspen and sagebrush stands to improve structural diversity and plant vigor.

The primary purpose for this burn is to improve vegetation diversity and wildlife habitat. An additional benefit will be reduction in hazardous fuels, which will improve management of future wildland fires. Prescribed fire will rejuvenate stagnant, decadent, and encroached sagebrush and aspen stands, which will improve wildlife habitat. The Weiner Creek Basin portion of this project area was burned in September of 2007. The remaining 1,100 acres in the North Fork of Murphy Creek is expected to be carried out between late-September and November.

Actual ignition will be dependent on meeting strict parameters for weather and fire behavior conditions. Forest users may experience temporary smoky conditions in the vicinity of the burn unit, along with the possibility of occasional, short-term trail or road closures.

Interagency fire managers will attempt to minimize any adverse impacts as the burn proceeds.
