

WILFIRE FACT SHEET August 31, 2020 Caribou-Targhee National Forest

The Dry Waterfall Fire was reported on Sunday, August 30, 2020. The fire is on a steep, rocky hillside and is approximately 0.5 acres in size. Five fire personnel are assigned to the fire. The cause of the fire is lightning.

The Smokey Hollow Fire was reported on Sunday, August 30, 2020. The fire is estimated at 17 acres. The fire is burning in timber stringers and smoke can be seen from a distance. Fire personnel are working to contain and control the fire.

There are no trail closures in effect at this time; however, forest users are urged to stay out of the fire area and to use extreme caution while hunting in the vicinity of the fire. Although fire behavior is moderated with the cooler weather, there is still a danger of active fire flare-ups and there may be helicopter activity in the area.
