"Our crews are still hard at work as we get ready to hand this incident back to the local unit."

UPDATE

On September 10, firefighters secured the perimeter of the Willow Creek Fire to 96%. Fire lines will continue to be monitored for snags and any sources of heat that could threaten containment until significant precipitation occurs. Suppression repair tactics will continue throughout the fire area, focusing on repairing roads, trails, and fire lines. The local unit is working with a burned area emergency response (BAER) team to plan and implement long-term restoration strategies.

CLOSURE INFORMATION
