Location: Bondurant, Wyoming
Date: Early May 2026, as conditions allow
Size: 85-100 Acres
Fuel types: Sage, grass, mixed conifer, and aspen, standing dead and down timber.

Description: This burn unit is part of the Monument Ridge Vegetation and Recreation Management project proposed by the Sublette County collaborative to address the hazards and threat from wildfire.

Within the project treatment area, there are two distinct treatment types, broadcast prescribed burning and slash pile burning.

Purpose: Reduce the potential threat to communities from wildfire by creating defensible space. Improve safety and access. Improve wildlife habitat.

The burn will also benefit aspen stands by creating a disturbance, encouraging aspen to sprout, and reduce conifer encroachment.

Closures: No closures are planned for this burn, but the public is asked to stay clear of the area during ignitions operations and following days while crews are working in the area. However, a closure order may be enacted if needed.

Smoke: Impacts from smoke should be minimal and of short duration. Visit [airnow.gov](https://fire.airnow.gov/) for smoke sensor data in the area.
