Eastern Great Basin Fire Activity Report 2006



Eastern Great Basin 2006 Activity Report

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Weather Review

Good snow pack and moderated drought conditions going into the 2006 fire season gave way to above normal temperatures, and below normal precipitation for July through mid-September.

An active Pacific storm track during the winter and spring brought a steady supply of rainfall and snow to the Intermountain West.


July – early August 2006

When the heart of summer rolled in, high pressure began to dominate the weather across the western US. This dominant high pressure regime led to below normal precipitation and above normal temperatures across much of the Great Basin.

Monsoon moisture began to move into the southern reaches of the area mid-late July. Most of this moisture remained limited to southeast and eastern Utah. With high temperatures and low relative humidity in place across the Great Basin dry thunderstorms moving north were efficient wildfire starters in southern and western Utah.

August 2006


After fuels had dried during the previous month of warm temperatures the upper level ridge gave way and several active weather systems impacted the region. With a warm, dry airmass already in place, most of these systems produced very little precipitation. Early August to mid September became a critical fire weather period for Idaho with many Red Flag Warnings issued for strong winds and dry thunderstorms. Western Wyoming saw dry conditions and thunderstorms during this time as well, but things weren't quite



as critical as Idaho. Little relief was felt elsewhere through August as conditions remained warm, dry and gusty in Utah.



September 2006

This critical fire weather pattern did not break until the second week in September when a series of stronger storms rolled through finally bringing measurable precipitation and cooler temperatures. This 'fall-like' weather pattern continued through September and the early part of October effectively bringing the 2006 wildfire season to a close.



Preparedness Level Review

Fire season started with a spike to preparedness level three early in June with a short respite before moving back up. This season proved to be active reaching preparedness level four by mid-July going to level five in early August and continuing into September. By mid-September activity gradually slowed reaching preparedness level one in early October with no spikes in activity.



Season Review

An active fire season prevailed this season despite above average snowpack and moderated drought conditions. Above normal temperatures and below normal precipitation combined with several lightning events during the months of July and August led to significant fire activity.

There were 3,202 fires for 1,244,452 acres this year. Fire occurrence was 21 percent above normal, while acres burned were three times above normal, compared to the previous five year average of 2,612 fires for 404,784 acres. Ignition occurrence and acres burned was higher on Bureau of Land Management lands followed by State lands. A break down of fires by cause, state and agency can be found on the following page.

The first large fire occurred May 12th on Utah, Southwest State lands. The first Type 2 Team mobilization occurred May 26th on Utah, Southeast State land, followed by the first Type 1 Team mobilization June 7th on Fishlake National Forest. The last large fire of the season was on Twin Falls District, BLM, and occurred November 21st. A break down of large fires by month is found below:

Seven-day coverage began on May 28th and continued through October 14th. There were eleven detail assignments in the Coordination Center this season.

The Great Basin Multi-agency Coordinating (MAC) Group was activated first, July 3rd through July 9th at Western Great Basin. The second activation was July 18th through September 15th and was at Eastern Great Basin. The Great Basin MAC Group was active for a total of 67 days.

Note: All fire and resource order statistics are from data available December 31, 2006. All fire statistics are taken from the Eastern Great Basin Situation Report and resource statistics are taken from the ROSS Data Delivery system.






Fire Activity Distribution by Agency

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Large Fire Activity Review

There were 185 large fires in Eastern Great Basin this season. This is more than two times the previous five year average of 86 large fires.

Large fires are classified as 100 acres or larger in timber fuel types, 300 acres or larger in grass fuel types, or when a Type 1 or Type 2 Incident Management Team is assigned. This also includes Wildland Fire Use incidents. The following is a summary of large fires for 2006 based on Incident Status Summaries (ICS-209s) received in Eastern Great Basin.


