2005 Weather and Fuels

For the first time in 6 years, Nevada started its fire season without having the shadow of long-term drought hanging over its head. After record-breaking winter precipitation and an unusually wet spring, the U.S. Drought Monitor took all of Nevada out of drought classification in its May 24, 2005 product.

The winter of 2004-2005 was an exceptional one. Las Vegas called it their “wettest winter on record” with almost 6 inches of precipitation at the McCarran International Airport. At the Nevada-Arizona border, Lake Mead rose 13 feet from October 2004 to February 2005. Death Valley, which usually receives less than 2 inches of rain per year, got 2 ½ inches in a single 2 week period. And northern Nevada was just as wet: Reno had roughly 4 feet of snow on the ground during the first days of January 2005, while Lake Tahoe accumulated more than 9 feet, prompting the governor of Nevada to seek federal disaster assistance.

Temperatures were near normal in early spring, but precipitation was highly variable. In April, precipitation was above normal across both eastern and western Nevada with some areas seeing over 200% of normal, while at the same time a swath of central Nevada from north to south had much below normal accumulations...only 20-25% of normal. May showed another strong variation in rainfall, with the northern 2/3 of the state averaging 250% of normal, while the extreme southern tip of the state (Clark County, far southern Lincoln and Nye Counties) had only roughly 20% of normal.

Fuels responded to the wet soil conditions and heavy mountain snow pack that existed across most of the state. The entire state had a significant green-up of annual fine fuels and southern Nevada reaped an unusually dense and widespread annual grass crop. Soil moisture was kept high by an active jet stream that kept offering periodic showers and thunderstorms with only short dry spells in between.

By the end of May and beginning of June, however, the jet stream retreated north and a temporary ridge of high pressure took its place. Temperatures had a sharp warming, causing rapid snowmelt in the mountains and the threat of flooding in the Sierra foothills.

The high moved east by mid-month and several deep troughs of low pressure moved through, producing windy conditions and numerous bouts of lightning...dry in southern Nevada and mostly wet in the north. During the final week of June the pattern appeared to be finally shifting into a more summer-like weather pattern with clear, dry and warm conditions.

By mid-summer, abundant and continuous fine fuels had cured across much of central and southern Nevada, with the remainder of the state not far behind. Annual fuels across much of Nevada had a fuel loading that had not been seen in recent years.

Record heat in July finished the curing process. A strong ridge of high pressure across the southwestern states led the Reno-Tahoe Airport to set a record with 10 days in a row over 100 degrees, as well as two days with all-time record high temperatures. Precipitation dropped to near zero in the Sierra and parts of western Nevada while much of the remainder of the state had

well above normal rainfall due to an unusual combination: the start of the annual shift in winds signaling the start of the southwest monsoon combined with the remnants of Hurricane Emily.

For the rest of the summer, a weather pattern took hold that produced wide variations in temperatures and precipitation: every few days a low pressure trough would move through the Pacific Northwest and increase southwesterly winds in Nevada. This would clear the skies and humidity would drop. But as soon as the trough passed, southeast winds would bring back the moisture and thunderstorms would return. Typically there would be 2-3 days of drying as the trough passed to the north, then for the next 4-5 days a surge of thunderstorms would cover most of the southern and eastern parts of the state. The leading edges of the thunderstorm surge were likely to have dry lightning the first day, but showers would follow that night or by the next day.

A shift in the weather pattern at the end of August and early September brought cooler temperatures and a couple of storm systems that pushed further down the west coast before moving inland across Nevada. As these systems moved through the state a few areas had heavy rainfall, though most of the state saw only traces or nothing at all.

The month of October signaled the end of the 2005 fire season. The gradual transition to colder temperatures, higher RH and reduced hours of daylight produced minimal fire activity. On one occasion, strong winds fanned a fire to 1000 acres during the afternoon burning period, but the fire quickly died down with lighter evening winds and went out overnight.

Fire Occurrence

Initial attack efforts were successful more than 93% of the time (5 year average = 95.5%) with 55 large fires occurring out of 811 total fires. 545 lightning caused fires totaling 1,653,671 acres accounted for 67% of occurrence and 95% of the total acreage burned, compared to the 5 year averages of 76% of occurrence and 87% of total acres. Total acres burned for all agencies combined equaled 1,735,609 acres, almost 6 times the 5 year average of 301,449 acres. This total number of acres burned is second only to the 1999 fire season which totaled 1,871,956 acres.

Team Mobilization

23 Incident Management Teams requests were processed by the WBC to support incidents for a total of 241 days committed. 17 IMT requests for wildfire were filled; 3 WBC Teams in NV, 3 WBC teams sent outside of NV and 9 teams were brought into NV for a total of 143 days. 3 IMT requests were filled by WBC teams for Preparedness/Preposition for 25 days. 3 Wildfire Use Team requests were filled to support other areas for 37 days. 2 IMT requests were filled by WBC teams to support the hurricanes for 36 days.

15 Buying Team requests were processed by the WBC to support wildfires for a total of 104 days committed. 1 Buying Team request was filled by a WBC team, 10 requests were filled outside of NV and 4 WBC team requests were filled for outside of NV.

Resource Requests

The Western Great Basin Coordination Center processed more total requests than any other year in the past for a grand total of 13,363. Part of the reason for this large number is that many aircraft, crew and equipment requests have subordinate requests, rosters or manifests for overhead) attached which subsequently inflates the total number of requests. After factoring in the “extra” requests, the numbers of requests for each resource category were still close to exceeding historic highs. Aircraft requests were second only to the year 2000. Crew requests were third highest compared to 1996 and 2000. Equipment requests set a new record, more than doubling the number requested in 1999. Overhead requests came in fourth, but still very close to the years 1999, 2000 and 2003. See the WBC Resource Requests Summary for 5 and 10 year averages.






WESTERN GREAT BASIN GEOGRAPHIC AREA LARGE FIRES 2005
