Great Basin Fire Potential Summary

Large fire potential will continue to remain LOW through most of this week due to recent wet weather. Light Initial Attack is expected today with light to moderate IA returning Friday through the weekend as lightning and winds increase, especially in the higher elevations.

Drier air and stronger winds are expected to increase fire potential to LOW-MODERATE in some small areas of southern/eastern/central NV and UT on Friday as winds peak with low RH in areas where fuels are critical.
