Weather Summary

Thunderstorms will develop again on Thursday mainly across Utah/southeast Idaho/Wyoming. Additionally, isolated showers and thunderstorms are possible over far eastern Nevada into south central and central Idaho, which would be a mix of wet/dry. By Friday thunderstorms will mainly be confined to the higher elevations of Utah/Wyoming and into central and southern Idaho.

A strong low pressure trough will approach the west coast later this week and move across the northern Great Basin Sunday/Monday. Ahead of this low winds will increase significantly Friday night and Saturday across the region with SW wind gusts 30-40+ mph, especially across Nevada and Idaho. However, RH will be increasing along with cooler temperatures and possibly some moisture to Idaho/northeast Nevada on Sunday. Drier air moves into the southern Great Basin this weekend, however isolated thunderstorms may continue over the higher elevations of Utah/western Wyoming through early next week.

Light IA activity across the geographic area today. Utah received light to moderate precipitation, while the remainder of the geographic area experienced scattered thunderstorms.

Resources:

- Tepee Springs incident has requested and been approved by NMAC for an IMT 1.
- Critical resource shortages continue nationally as well as within the Great Basin.
- We are asking local centers to continue canvassing their area for available resources that may be showing available local in ROSS that may, in fact, be available within the GACC.

There are no National Caterers, Shower units, BUYTs, or IMTs available at this time. Still significant shortages of IHCs as well as T2IA crews.

Great Basin Fire Potential Summary

Fire danger remains moderate to high over Nevada and Idaho due to recent dry and warm weather and will be decreasing this week across Utah/western Wyoming/southeast Idaho as showers and thunderstorms continue. However, Fire Danger indices are higher now than they have been most of the summer across much of the Great Basin.

The expected isolated mixed wet/dry lightning activity Thursday over eastern Nevada/south central Idaho and the central Idaho mountains may result in new initial attack and potential large fire activity. Stronger winds will affect the ongoing incidents in Idaho on Saturday, however RH will be increasing along with cooler temperatures. In the meantime, IA will likely still occur across Utah through this week as widely scattered thunderstorms continue.
