Date/Time Stamp: **Sunday, August 30, 2015 - 10:27 PM**

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### Weather Summary

Gusty winds will develop over eastern Idaho and southwest Utah ahead of this next front.

Dry west/southwest flow returns to the Great Basin for the early part of the week with gradually warming temperatures regionwide. Another trough moves into the Pacific Northwest for the second half of the work week causing an increase in southwest winds ahead of the front. The front will move into Idaho in the Wednesday/Thursday timeframe and will likely bring isolated to scattered showers to the central Idaho mountains.

Dry westerly flow will return for the weekend. Utah and Nevada will remain generally dry and breezy through the period with near normal to slightly above normal temperatures.
