Weather Summary

...HIGH RISK for Wind Monday Western NV and Sierra Front...

...Much Cooler with Significant Precipitation Many Areas by Middle of Next Week...

Lightning activity tonight may have only light rainfall amounts over parts of the Sierra Front into western/northern NV, especially north of Highway 50.

SW winds will be increasing significantly on Monday ahead of the low moving across Pac NW. Deeper moisture will likely move into the Great Basin Monday through mid-week with more widespread, longer duration wetting rains across much of the region, as a low pressure moves across the area. **Lightning can still be expected with these rains.** Temperatures will also cool 10-20 degrees from the warm temperatures of this weekend, and drop to below normal.

Drier and warmer weather expected later in the week into next weekend, however temperatures will only likely return to near normal.

Great Basin Fire Potential Summary

Fire danger has gradually increased the past few days, along with initial attack as fuels have steadily dried out during our current warm/dry pattern. Fuels are most critical across northwest and north central Nevada where ERC's are above the 80th percentile, and near the driest levels of the season.

Across northwest Nevada and the Sierra Front, where fuels are critically dry...the upcoming lightning late today into tonight has prompted the issuance of **HIGH RISK, although coverage may remain isolated or widely scattered and some areas will see some rainfall.**

In addition, stronger SW winds Monday across these same areas has prompted us to issue **HIGH RISK** for a combination of winds and critically dry fuels for much of the same region. However, RH will be increasing on Monday along with some showers. Please refer to the map for details.

Widespread precipitation by late Monday thru midweek should have a significant effect on fire potential with nearly all areas being pushed into the **Moist** category.
