Weather Summary

*** Dry and Hot Weather over the Northern 2/3 of the Great Basin into Early Next Week ***

*** Lightning Returning to Parts of UT/Southern NV into Early Next Week and Spreading Northwest Later in the Week ***

Drier air pushes into the region by this coming weekend and will spread across the Great Basin, including most of Utah on Sunday...increasing the possibility of lightning holdovers. Temperatures will be on the rise to 8-12 degrees above normal through next week as high pressure dominates the Great Basin. Winds will also decrease in most areas. Some breezy SW-W winds will continue today over south central ID into western WY with some breezes at times next Tue/Wed.

Lightning with showers will likely continue today over eastern UT, with a dry day region-wide on Sunday. However lightning chances may quickly return to Utah on Monday/Tuesday and also develop in southern NV. These thunderstorms over the western half of UT and southern NV will likely be a mix of wet and dry and we will monitor this for any increase in fire potential in areas that have been very dry. Lightning chances continue over southern NV/southwest UT/AZ Strip through Thursday with drier weather elsewhere.

Moisture will likely spread from south to north later in the week into next week with thunderstorms developing across NV and into ID and this will need to be monitored as these areas have been extremely dry over the last 1-2 months. Timing, coverage and moisture are still uncertain.

Great Basin Fire Potential Summary

ERCs have decreased significantly over eastern Utah where wetting rains with thunderstorms developed over the past week. However, ERCs elsewhere are quite high, with many areas in the 90th to 97th percentile. ERCs will continue to climb across the western and northern portions of the Great Basin where hot and/or dry/breezy weather will continue. ERCs will also increase across all of Utah this weekend and again from mid to late week as dry and hot weather returns.

A Fuel and Fire Behavior Advisory is also in effect for the Northern half of Nevada, Southwest Idaho and Northwest Utah.
