Weather Summary

***** HIGH RISK - Sat-Sun for Lightning Central ID Mtns/Wrn WY *****

***** HIGH RISK - Sun for Wind/Low RH/Dry Fuels Parts of NW UT and SE ID *****

Moderate Lightning Activity occurred late Friday into Early Saturday across Ern NV into Much of Idaho. Holdover potential highest over Idaho, much less over Ern NV and Utah where wetting rains also occurred. Most unstable air and best lightning potential shifts eastwards across parts of the Salmon-Challis NF to Ern ID and Wrn WY this afternoon.

Drier weather and some breezy winds quickly move in from southwest to northeast across NV today and into Utah and SE ID on Sunday. Where RH and fuels are driest, across far Northern UT and SE ID, we could see SW winds of 25-35 mph on Sunday.

A drying trend thru this coming week. There could be near critical WSW Zephyr winds coming off the Sierra Front at times, where fuels remain critically dry. Even southern areas should very slowly dry out as the Monsoon shifts south and east out of our entire region.

Great Basin Fire Potential Summary

***** Fuels at Record Dry Levels in Many Areas Over the Northern Half of the Great Basin *****

ERCs which have recently decreased significantly **into the 90th to 97th percentile** across most areas (except for the southern 3rd of the Great Basin) will pose concerns for both lightning and wind effects over this weekend. However, with thunderstorms turning wetter by Sunday in many Northern areas, ERC's will be going down a bit across ID, Western WY.

Fuels will remain most critical across some areas of Western and Northern NV which have not had widespread wetting rains for nearly 2 months.

Live fuel moisture across much of the northern half of NV, northern UT and parts of ID are near or at record dry levels as well.

These existing extremely dry fuel conditions across Idaho/Western and Northern Utah/Wyoming will play a critical role in fire potential for holdovers from recent lightning, or new lightning starts.

A Fuel and Fire Behavior Advisory is also in effect for the Northern half of Nevada, Southwest Idaho and Northwest Utah.
