### Weather Summary


\*\*\* **HIGH RISK for LIGHTNING WEDNESDAY NE NEVADA...NRN UTAH...CENTRAL/ERN IDAHO...WRN WYOMING** \*\*\*

\*\*\* **HIGH RISK for WIND/LOW RH IDAHO and NR NV WED/THU** \*\*\*

As low pressure moves into the Pacific NW, along with a cold front...winds will start to increase today ahead of the front across Northern and Western NV into Western ID, spreading east across the rest of ID/WY and Nrn UT Wednesday. **High Risk** has been issued for parts of ID where winds might be strongest today, in areas of existing large fires, and also for parts of northeast NV Thursday after lightning moves through and along the Sierra Front due to risk of spread of any human starts.

At the same time, **isolated to scattered thunderstorms with gusty winds** are now expected to form near and ahead of the cold front moving into northern NV/ID on Wednesday, with the most likely areas being NE NV, Central and Eastern ID, Western WY and far Northern UT. **Thunderstorms will also likely continue overnight** Wednesday into Thursday morning over parts of Southern ID, Northern UT and far Northeast NV. These thunderstorms will likely be fast moving, with only light amounts of precipitation expected on Wednesday and Wednesday night. **High Risk** has been issued for these areas (see map). Thunderstorms will continue Thursday over Southeast ID, WY and UT, with somewhat higher RH and possibly some rainfall, but heavier amounts will likely not be very widespread. Therefore there will still be a threat of new starts and spread on Thursday as SW winds also remain breezy.

Behind the front Thursday, continued breezy conditions expected with lower RH in parts of NV into possibly far SW ID. There will also be a cooling trend behind the front into the weekend where temperatures will drop to 5-10 degrees below normal, however SW-W winds will remain gusty. Some additional showers and higher RH possible over the central ID Mountains Friday.

**Great Basin Fire Potential Summary**

ERC's remain near or beyond the 97th percentile across a large portion of northern Nevada, Idaho, western Wyoming and far northern Utah. With ongoing fires in ID and western WY into northern UT there is the potential for significant growth still in the coming days as breezy, drier and warmer weather returns. **High Risk** for wind/low RH issued for Idaho in areas that have ongoing large fires. Dry lightning in areas of extremely dry fuels in NE Nevada and Ern Idaho, as well as western Wyoming and northern Utah Wednesday. Moist fuel conditions are expected to continue across southern portions of UT/NV and AZ Strip this week.

**A Fuel and Fire Behavior Advisory** is also in effect for the northern half of Nevada, southern Idaho, and northwest Utah.
