*****MUCH COOLER TEMPERATURES and SHOWERS to Idaho, western Wyoming and northern Nevada*****

Showers and thunderstorms will overspread much of Idaho, western Wyoming, far northern Nevada and Utah. Snow possible above 7500 feet across the higher terrain of Idaho and Wyoming.

The southern half of the Great Basin will see the cooler temperatures but remain on the drier side, especially by the first part of next week as westerly flow returns....with a gradual warming/drying for all areas this coming week.

Great Basin Fire Potential Summary

ERC's starting to retreat a bit due to recent cooler weather, but many remain between the **90th to 97th percentile** across a large portion of Northern Nevada, Southeast Idaho, western Wyoming and far northern Utah, which is near above records. With ongoing fires in Idaho, western Wyoming and northern Utah, there is the potential for significant growth still in the next 24-36 hours in areas that experience increasing winds and humidities below 25%, which will be primarily Utah and Nevada. **High Risk** for wind/Low RH issued for northern Utah and central Utah Mountains.

Across the mountains of Idaho into Western WY, a prolonged period of high humidity and longer duration wetting rains will reset fuels across that region early this week, pushing many PSA's into the **"Moist"** category.

Moist fuel conditions are expected to continue across southern portions of Utah, Nevada, and Arizona Strip this week, with some into the middle of next week.

A Fuel and Fire Behavior Advisory remains in effect for the Northern half of Nevada, Southern Idaho, and Northwest Utah.
