DISCUSSION...

CLOUDS AND PRECIPITATION WILL INCREASE THROUGHOUT THE DAY TODAY AHEAD OF AN APPROACHING COLD FRONT. IN ADDITION SOUTH TO SOUTHWEST WINDS WILL INCREASE BY THIS AFTERNOON ACROSS ALL OF WESTERN MONTANA AND NORTH CENTRAL IDAHO. A STRONG COLD FRONT WILL MOVE THROUGH TONIGHT INTO SATURDAY BRINGING WIDESPREAD WETTING RAINS AND MOUNTAIN SNOW. WINDS WILL INCREASE AND BECOME GUSTY SATURDAY AFTERNOON WITH GUSTS OF 40-50 MPH POSSIBLE. A COOL AND ACTIVE WEATHER PATTERN WILL REMAIN THROUGH NEXT WEEK.

Area Discussion:

THIS WILL BE THE LAST AFTERNOON REPORT FOR THE 2012 SEASON

Missoula County Fire Protection Association has announced a return to LOW fire danger after a very arduous wildland fire season. Recent rains and cool seasonal temperatures have lowered the fire danger to levels that allow for issuance of outdoor burning permits in Missoula County, effective Wednesday, October 17th.

MT-DNRC has announced a conclusion to the 2012 Fire Season, effective midnight tonight. The state is doing so, realizing that some counties across the state remain in Fire Restrictions where the threat of wildfires escaping initial attack persist at a high level. The following jurisdictions remain in Stage I Restrictions:

Ravalli County – Open Burning ban has been rescinded effective midnight tonight, October 19.
 Private land within Butte-Silver Bow County
 Private land within Granite County

The following jurisdictions have rescinded Stage I Restrictions:

Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest
 Powell County
 Mineral County
 Bitterroot National Forest - Stage I Fire Restrictions will be lifted effective midnight tonight, October 19.
