

This report summarizes the 2014 fire season within the South West Montana Dispatch Zone and Missoula Interagency Dispatch Center’s (MIDC) Initial Attack area. A special thanks to all that helped gather statistics for this report.

MIDC’s initial attack area consists of federal, state, and private lands protected by Missoula Unit DNRC of the Southwestern Land Office (SWLO), Missoula, Ninemile, and Seeley Lake Ranger Districts of the Lolo National Forest.

MIDC provides support services to Clearwater Unit / Lincoln IA Station, Anaconda Unit / Garrison IA Station of Montana DNRC SWLO; Plains Dispatch Center, whose main service is to Plains Unit DNRC of the Northwestern Land Office (NWLO), Superior and Plains-Thompson Falls Ranger Districts of the Lolo National Forest; Ronan Dispatch, whose main service is to the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes on the Flathead Reservation, the National Bison Range, Ninepipe National Wildlife Refuge, and Pablo National Wildlife Refuge.

Missoula Interagency Dispatch Center (MIDC) dispatched IA resources to 397 local incidents and tracked 581 flights (1/1 thru 12/31/14). Aside from aircraft flight following, the majority of WildCAD incidents recorded at MIDC were wildfires, with the second highest number being smoke checks.

Averages:

The tables to the right summarize the average fires and acres for the past 30 years for the 3 land based agencies within the Southwest Montana Zone.

BLM’s Missoula Field Office does not have suppression responsibilities for BLM land within the zone.

DNRC’s Southwestern Land Office (SWLO) has suppression responsibility on all BLM lands within the SW MT Zone except for a small portion west of Clinton and around Rock Creek (approximately 100 ac.), which is protected by the Lolo NF.



Fires by Statistical Cause:

In 2014 56% of the season’s fires within Missoula Dispatch Center’s initial attack area were human caused, and 44% were lightning. There were numerous non-statistical fires (campfires still within the ring and not a threat), and numerous smoke checks that ended up being false alarms.

The chart and table below reflects only fires within MIDC’s initial attack area (Missoula Unit, Missoula RD, Ninemile RD, and Seeley Lake RD).

Large Fires:

During the 2014 fire season, the Lolo NF hosted one Type 2 IMT; DNRC's Southwestern Land Office hosted one Type 3 IMT: Missoula County All Hazard Team (MCAH); and the CSKT hosted one Type 2 IMT. Additionally 2 fires on the Lolo NF were managed under Type 3 organizations; DNRC managed one additional Type 3 incident, and assisted Missoula County with one Type 3 incident; and CSKT managed 4 incidents under Type 3 organizations.

Prescribed Fire Accomplishment:

The Lolo National Forest treated 15,513 acres with management-ignited burns during 2014. DNRC Missoula Unit, and Clearwater Unit of the Southwestern Land Office treated a total of 130 acres, and Plains Unit of the Northwestern Land Office treated 751 acres. BLM's Missoula Field Office treated 327 acres, and the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes treated 2,816 acres.

Resource Orders:

The 2014 fire season in the Southwestern Montana Zone was fairly slow locally compared with past seasons, giving more opportunities for local resources to take out-of-area assignments. In April and May we processed requests for engines, miscellaneous overhead, and aircraft to the Southwest, utilizing the R1/R3 Agreement to boost their initial attack resources. Towards the end of May and first part of June, we mobilized one Type 1, and two Type 2IA agency crews and miscellaneous overhead to Alaska. In mid-July we were getting multiple requests for crews, equipment, overhead, and aircraft to Oregon and Washington as they're fire season literally exploded, due to extreme drought and numerous ignitions from dry thunderstorms. As Region 6 continued to burn, California started requesting multiple resources to boost their IA resources, as they were also experiencing extreme drought throughout the entire state. We continued to support both Region 5 and Region 6 throughout the remainder of the season.

Initial attack activity started to pick up in the zone and GACC in May with mostly human caused fires. We did experience some early season thunderstorms in June igniting a few small lightning fires, but most storms were accompanied with precipitation. As we moved towards July, the thunderstorms were more frequent with lightning and locally heavy precipitation. New fire starts didn't really experience much growth until late July, and August. The season didn't seem to last very long, really slowing down by the second week in September. We never really received our "season ending event", but due to shorter days, higher humidity's, and cooler temperatures, fire season just fizzled out.

The chart below summarizes the number of resource orders that were processed in ROSS at Missoula Interagency Dispatch Center (MIDC). Each category, with the exception of overhead and supplies, are addressed further in the following report by functional area.



Missoula Interagency Dispatch Center Annual Report 2014

The following equipment report was prepared by Kerry Cassidy, Equipment Dispatcher at MIDC.

A large part of the equipment dispatched in 2014 was for out-of-zone or out-of-region assignments. Soft Tracks and Pumper Cats were in demand more this year than in the past with a total of 65 days assigned to fires. Engines and Tenders from our cooperators, and contract equipment on our Dispatch Priority List (DPL) comprised the majority of the equipment requests filled. The R1/R3 Agreement was also utilized by districts on the Lolo NF for engines going to and coming from the Southwest. We were able to recruit three new Trainee Equipment Inspectors to help at the inspection site, which was once again at Fort Missoula, along with the Ground Support Unit. The inspections were steady, with a peak of 32 pieces of equipment inspected in a single day.




The Missoula Aircraft statistics were taken from October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014. This was a relatively slow season with a total of 703 flights. The following summary will show how many and what types of aircraft we tracked, the workload break down for 2014, our workload 5-year average, detection flights, and who reported our fires. Keep in mind this report only reflects the workload of the Missoula Aircraft Desk and does not include aircraft tracked by Lolo-West (Plains Dispatch) or the CS&K Tribes (Ronan Dispatch)

October, April, May and September were our busiest months for ordering aircraft on our On-Demand Project contract for prescribed fire. Seven forests/units requested 21 aircraft. All were filled and 2 were cancelled due to weather.



For the 2014 season we flew a total of 222 aircraft on local incidents.




Fixed-wing aircraft continue to be the bulk of our flight tracking work load. This includes incident, administrative and training flights.





The margin narrows slightly for local incident aircraft with 139 fixed-wing flights and 83 rotor-wing flights tracked by MDC.



For the MDC Aircraft desk fire season peaked in August with a total of 355 flights.










The peak 2014 fire season lasted roughly three weeks in early August. The zone began to pick up relatively frequent human caused wildfires in early April. These were the main cause of wildfires until lightning fires became the primary source of ignition in mid-July through the beginning of September. With a very dry May, ERC's set new maximums in early June, but returned to average by the middle of the month and continued that way throughout the rest of the season. The ERC's reached above the 90th percentile in early August, quickly dropping with a couple August rain events. The 1000 hour fuels corresponded as well with the rising ERC's in May-early June, reaching new minimum lows for that time period, but rebounded to average for the rest of the season.

The bouncing weather and general low number fire starts added up to 2014 being an average fire season for the SWZ.










The charts below show 2007 and 2013 as comparison years because both years were large fire years locally.
