The wildland fire agencies often hire equipment to aid with fire and other incident support. This handout is a brief summary of the procedures and basic requirements to contract for this type of work. In the Northern Rockies, we usually have a need for some vendor support every summer, but there is no way to predict the amount of activity or the level of support we will need, and there is no guarantee that that you will receive an order.

Most of our incident support equipment agreements are competed and awarded preseason on a 3-year basis through agency procurement programs. Please see the list of the equipment below that has been solicited and awarded preseason by the Forest Service and National Park Service. Other than our preseason competed agreements, we will <u>NOT</u> be keeping a source list of these types of equipment.

Source list equipment will be required to pass an inspection at the time of hire. Please see the Northern Rockies Coordinating Group Chapter 20 Supplement to the NWCG Standards for Interagency Incident Business Management for equipment specifications.

The following are the requirements to contract your equipment or services with the federal government.

- Dun and Bradstreet (DUNS) Registration http://www.dnb.com or 1-866-705-5711
- System for Award Management (SAM) Registration (This has replaced CCR & ORCA)
 - Use this link: https://www.sam.gov. There is NO charge to register in SAM, but be aware there are companies asking for money to register you. Use the link above as it is the correct link and will NOT charge you.
 - o If you are currently registered in SAM, please ensure your account is updated annually.

• Training and Work Capacity Testing

- Heavy Equipment Operators are required to pass the Light Walk Test (walk 1 mile in 16 minutes or less). Carry the following (one copy during fire pre-use inspections & fire assignment):
 - A statement from the Company Owner that all individuals completed in 2021 the Annual Safety Refresher (RT-130) and Light Walk Work Capacity Test.
 - 2021 Health Screening Questionnaire signed by employee and company owner.
- All other fire personnel that spend the night in fire camp and/or are assigned to the fireline have completed a 2021 Fire Safety Refresher & if required WCT; carry one copy during fire pre-use inspections and fire assignment:
 - A statement from the company owner that all individuals completed in 2021 the Annual Safety Refresher (RT-130) & Light Walk Work Capacity Test.
 - 2021 Health Screening Questionnaire signed by employee and company owner.
- All fire personnel must meet the current NWCG/NRCG training and physical fitness standards as defined in US Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, Montana DNRC, or Idaho Dept. of Lands Incident Blanket Purchase Agreements
